### **CLIMATE CHANGE IMPACTS**







#### DO - Abnormally Dry

. Soil is dry; irrigation delivery begins early

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- . Dryland crop germination is stunted
- · Active fire season begins



#### D1 - Moderate Drought

- Dryland pasture growth is stunted; producers give supplemental feed to cattle
- Landscaping and gardens need irrigation earlier; wildlife patterns begin to change
- . Stock ponds and creeks are lower than usual



### D2 - Severe Drought

- · Grazing land is inadequate
- Producers increase water efficiency methods and drought-resistant crops
- Fire season is longer, with high burn intensity, dry fuels, and large fire spatial extent; more fire crews are

### D3 - Extreme Drought



- Livestock need expensive supplemental feed, cattle and horses are sold; little pasture remains, producers find it difficult to maintain organic meat
- · Fruit trees bud early; producers begin irrigating in the
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
#### D4 - Exceptional Drought

- Fields are left fallow; orchards are removed; vegetable yields are low; honey harvest is small.
- Fire season is very costly; number of fires and area burned are extensive
- . Many recreational activities are affected



# **Project Outcomes**

- To build the capacity and elevate the voices of organizations and community members serving and representing low-income and disadvantaged communities in civic processes related to climate resilience and electrification efforts
- 2. To increase the access to information, education, equipment, and resources for organizations and community members serving and representing low-income and historically disadvantaged communities as related to climate resilience and electrification efforts
- To broaden the community network around building climate resilience and electrification efforts to include organizations and community members serving and representing low-income and disadvantaged communities



# COMMUNITY ACCESS TO RESILIENCE MEASURES & ELECTRIFICATION ENGAGEMENT PILOT PROGRAM

### **Key Points:**

- City of Berkeley funded/contracted Project
- Total funding: \$100,000, 2-years (Fall 2022- Fall 2024)
  - \$50,000 to Ecology Center staffing/project oversight
  - \$50,000 for Climate Equity Collaborative support
- Targeted Audience: City of Berkeley community,
   low-income/income-qualified Berkeley residents, Black, Indigenous,
   People of Color (BIPOC), and other marginalized community members
- Eligible Expenses:
  - Providing access to resilience measures: induction cooktop hobs, portable batteries, air purifiers, transit passes, shared electric mobility memberships, etc.
  - Outreach, education and community **engagement**
  - Capacity Building- stipends, "mini-grant" projects



## DATA COLLECTION

Targeted Audience: City of Berkeley community, low-income/income-qualified Berkeley residents, Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC), and other marginalized community members

#### Drafted Metrics:

- Feelings on decision-making power
- # of workshop/presentation attendees
- # of community supports utilized
- # of resilience measures distributed
- % of low-income/income-qualified participants
- Demographic Data of households/individuals reached (race, age, etc.)
- Photos of resilience measure in-use

#### Methodology:

- One on one's
- Surveys
- Qualitative data (photos, stories, agendas, etc.)



# BUILDING CAPACITY | COMMUNITY SUPPORTS

#### Budget Considerations:


- Total funding: \$100,000, 2-years (Fall 2022- Fall 2024)
- \$37,000 for Climate Equity Collaborative support
  - \$20k total for community stipends
  - \$5k for community supports (food, space rental, childcare, translation, etc.)
  - \$12k resilience measure purchases

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

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
