Project Purpose

To work as a community to better understand and address the growing urban heat problem in the Louisville area.

Key Lessons Learned

Dr. Stone came to Louisville for the project kickoff meeting and the project team used the opportunity to engage the public in the conversation about Louisville's urban heat island problem. Additional tools and tactics were employed that were shared with the other sustainability directors.

The city sustainability director interacted with the local place-based foundation to share the preliminary heat assessment data. Communication was a vital aspect of this project and the project team continually strived to include the local place-based foundation in the knowledge loop.
