## **Project Purpose**

To enable a diverse, under-served neighborhood to develop a community energy plan that delivers climate solutions that redress local disparities in housing, health, and economic opportunity.

## **Key Lessons Learned**

Lessons learned about tools and tactics through the project that other sustainability directors could use to advance their work.

Historically, there was minimal equity/community participation in Oregon's renewable energy sector. As a result of the grant-funded work, a path to set an equity-driven agenda for the renewable energy sector was created. Existing stakeholders responded to advocacy/ideas from new participants like Verde, Living Cully and the Coalition of Communities of Color to support a more inclusive marketplace. A certain baseline knowledge was needed to develop an informed, realistic neighborhood scale energy plan, knowledge that was unavailable in community organizations at the time -- especially organizations that benefit low-income communities and communities of color.

Lessons for developing a collaborative process between a local government sustainability director and local place-based foundation(s).

The relationship between the Sustainability Director and Foundation was strengthened through the sharing of information about projects both entities were funding and supporting each other's work.
